

Malking Trails


On October 5, 2023, BRC celebrated the grand opening of the Crist Farm Walking Trails with a dedication ceremony with residents, team members, project partners, and other community members all in attendance.

The walking trails are open daily from dawn to dusk and located off Will Lane adjacent to Oakdale Park in Bridgewater. The 20-acre nature area contains approximately 1.2 miles of ADA-accessible walkways, overlooks, a labyrinth, a wildflower meadow, and much more!

The trails were made possible by a generous contribution from BRC residents Edgar and Kathy Simmons, while the land was donated by Paige and Ann Will back in 2000. Carrie Budd, Vice President for the BRC Foundation worked on this project since its early conception and highlighted the importance the trails bring to the community stating, "We know how important environmental wellness is to lead an active and engaged life. This addition to our campus will provide residents at all levels of living the opportunity to spend time outdoors exploring, picnicking, birdwatching, spending time with family, and more."



We love the idea of elementary school kids coming on field trips, nature lovers exploring the site, and Bridgewater College classes coming as well. And our residents are hungry for a place to walk close by where they can experience nature."

Opening Minds Through Art



BRC launched Opening Minds Through Art (OMA) in the spring with the collaboration of team member facilitators, fueled by a generous grant from LeadingAge Virginia. The program continued into the fall thanks to funding from the BRC Foundation's Energized Life Fund. This transformative program fosters connections between residents living with dementia and dedicated volunteers, providing them with a designated space to unleash their imagination through art. Volunteers undergo specialized training to collaborate with resident artists, turning their expressions into masterpieces.

Enhanced Fitness Programming





The Fitness Team has been hard at work this year, making some dynamic transformations! A new TRX system was installed in the Fitness Center and two yoga coaches, Dana Neff and Robin Atwood, were introduced for varied mind/body classes.

Fulfilling the Dream of a Wellness Garden







BRC opened its peaceful wellness garden in September adjacent to Lantz Chapel. The space is a beautiful spot to enjoy the outdoors, but also doubles as a healing location for therapy clients. The mixed-terrain pathways, sensory stimulation, and relaxation areas will enhance the recovery process for clients and help provide mobility practice and strength.

Promoting Sustainability





BRC is increasingly conscious of sustainability and launched initiatives such as electric vehicle (EV) charging stations, composting, food waste reduction, and decreased night-time hall lighting. The dining team introduced OZZI reusable food containers to reduce plastic waste in our dining venues, and BRC looks forward to showcasing the positive impact these measures will have on the community in the future. The success of our first "Bags to Benches" campaign inspired BRC volunteers to continue the momentum, and the first recycled outdoor bench from NexTrex now sits outside Gardner House.

BRC resumed its health fair just in time for the holidays, offering preventative screenings and interactive wellness sessions to residents and team members. Park View Credit Union, VPAS, and our very own Back on Track Massage were just a few of the wonderful vendors providing engaging information on various community resources.

Farmer's Market







This summer, BRC launched its very own Farmer's Market series, bringing the farm-fresh goodness right to our doorstep! Partnering with Cavalier Produce, we delighted residents with a diverse selection of locally sourced produce, fulfilling their desire for fresh, flavorful ingredients without having to venture far from home. The Dining Team stepped up to the plate, wowing attendees with cooking demos that



showcased mouthwatering dishes crafted from the market's bounty. From juicy fruits to crisp veggies, our market offerings inspired culinary creativity and delighted taste buds.

Featuring favorite vendors like Bluestone Vineyard, Harmony Harvest Farm, Harvest Table, and Raw Mountain Honey, our markets became bustling hubs of community activity. It wasn't just about the food; it was about supporting local businesses and fostering connections right here in our own backyard.

Senior Prom



Last year's Senior Prom at BRC was a highlight for both residents and the team. What began as an idea to brighten residents' lives with string lights transformed into a full-scale event. Donations of formal wear were collected for those without appropriate attire, and team members spent the day in Nursing Households assisting residents in preparation. Independent Living resident Michael Chumbley noted, "They infused so much energy into the event that it gave us energy on the dance floor." Senior Prom, the first project supported by the Energized Life Fund, will return later this year.





Spiritual Life Programming



BRC is expanding its focus on spiritual well-being and Russ Barb, Director of Spiritual Life, is very excited about the future! The Spiritual Well-Being Team will collaborate closely with the Life Enrichment Team to connect all dimensions of wellness. Russ notes a steady increase in counseling visits related to grief and loss, so BRC is looking forward to jumpstarting clinical pastoral education and Chaplaincy graduate training in the future.

Russ is also excited to work with his team to share the stories and outcomes behind what they do, stating "Whole-person wellness is not what we say, but what we do—we are leaders in the industry; we've done our homework and we're doing the best we can do for our residents."

Technology Support & Education Specialist





With the success of Wellzesta and BRC's continued focus on innovation, BRC welcomed Reece Adkins to the Well-Being Team! Reece swiftly stepped into the role of Technology Support and Education Specialist and has been busy organizing help desks and immersive workshops for residents, addressing tech support tickets, and much more.

Special Events All Year Long








